It's hard to believe that I have less than 90 days remaining in my term as mayor of Renton. The past 12 years have flown by and I'm spending some time reflecting on what we have accomplished during this time. I have also been giving a lot of thought about new leadership that will take the helm at City Hall in January.

Two people who I have worked with for many years are running for mayor. Both care deeply about this community and they have contributed their time and personal resources to support important, local projects. Still, both candidates have very different skills when it comes to leadership, management and team-building.

I feel the best person to continue to move Renton ahead is Armondo Pavone.

For the past six years as a city council member, Armondo has worked closely with all of our department administrators and has earned their respect. He was born in Renton, graduated from Renton High, has been a successful business owner for over 30 years, and is a dedicated husband and father of two young boys.

Armondo has been an active participant as we developed significant goals for the City, and he understands the need to be flexible, collaborative and engaging of our residents as Renton moves forward over the next few years.

Renton has changed dramatically during the past decade, mostly in a very positive way. We have evolved into a city that is truly a desired place to live, learn and do business.
